Overdose Education & Naloxone Distribution


OVERVIEW: Overdose Education & Naloxone Distribution (OEND) in South Dakota is the result of a partnership between the Department of Health and Department of Social Services to reduce harm and risk of life-threatening overdoses and opioid-related deaths. Led by the Office of Rural Health, the project aims to educate, train, and equip emergency medical service personnel and other first responders on the rising dangers of opioids, how to recognize an opioid overdose, and the use of NARCAN® (Naloxone HCl) Nasal Spray to reverse an overdose.



SINCE OCTOBER 2017...

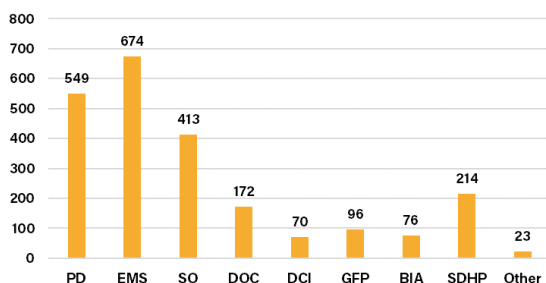
 174 patients had an 'improved response' after at least one dose of NARCAN® from EMS personnel

 Over 2,200 NARCAN® kits have been distributed across South Dakota to individuals trained in OEND

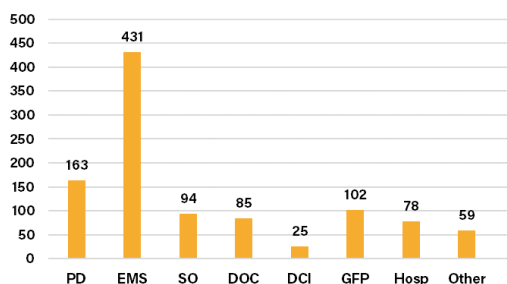
 More than 1,000 first responders have been trained to recognize and respond to an opioid overdose
