OVERDOSE EDUCATION & NALOXONE DISTRIBUTION (OEND)


OEND in South Dakota is the result of a partnership between the Department of Health and Department of Social Services to reduce harm and risk of life-threatening overdoses and opioid-related deaths. Efforts include education and training of emergency medical service personnel and other first responders on the rising dangers of opioids, how to recognize an opioid overdose, and the use of naloxone to reverse an opioid overdose. Individuals at risk or in a position to assist someone at risk can access naloxone at participating pharmacies statewide with funding assistance available.



AS OF OCTOBER 2023...

DISTRIBUTION NUMBERS

Naloxone kits are distributed to first responders, treatment agencies, schools, and other organizations seeking to be equipped with emergency access to naloxone.



STRATEGIES



Support training for emergency responders and others in a position to assist to receive education about recognizing and responding to a suspected opioid overdose, and expand access to that training through online learning.



Provide emergency responders and South Dakota organizations that serve clients who may be at risk with NARCAN® (naloxone HCI), equipping them with life-saving medication to use for a suspected opioid overdose.



Facilitate a statewide standing order allowing pharmacies to dispense naloxone to anyone at risk of an opioid-related overdose or those in a position to assist someone at risk (family members, friends or close third party).
